It requires a completed Level 1 — Facilitator and leads professionals from the preventive public stance of the Facilitator level to autonomous intervention, counselling and support work in acute bullying situations. Graduates obtain the certificate “Certified Professional in Bullying Prevention and Intervention H.A.B.A.”. The programme has an international focus and is structured in line with recognised quality standards.

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2 Target group and admission requirements

3 Competence objective

A HABA Coach & Trainer specialist can autonomously carry out bullying interventions in ongoing cases, advise schools in bullying situations and support them long-term, lead continuing education for teaching teams, and professionally support affected persons and their parents in acute bullying cases. They carry out structured case analyses, select intervention approaches appropriate to the phase and context, hold conversations with parents in situations of high emotional strain, maintain the stance of multipartiality even under pressure, and know the limits of their role with regard to therapy, school psychology services, child and youth protection, and the justice system.

4 Content axes

The course is structured into four modules of two course days each (eight days).

MODULE I**Methodological foundations & case analysis**

Individual-psychological and systemic foundations · cyberbullying in intervention practice · structured HABA case analysis as an integrative procedure.

MODULE III**School counselling & continuing education for teaching teams**

School counselling, continuing education for teaching teams and a comparison of intervention programmes; interdisciplinary cooperation and points of intersection.

MODULE II**Supporting affected persons & parent counselling**

Supporting affected children and adolescents — context-sensitive and system-oriented, individualised according to lifestyle and personality profile; counselling and support of parents.

MODULE IV**Crises, stance & public presence**

Crisis situations, stance under pressure, professional ethics and professional public presence as a HABA Coach & Trainer.

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5 The written assignment

The written assignment is the central assessment of learning. It comprises three parts:

Part 1 · Intervention case study	A real intervention case, presented in a structured way and framed holistically (10,000–13,000 characters).
Part 2 · Conceptual work	A school-counselling or teaching-team-training concept (10,000–13,000 characters).
Part 3 · Reflective part	Reflection on one's own stance and role (4,000–6,000 characters).

Total 24,000–32,000 characters · APA style · anonymised · pass / fail assessment; one revision possible.

6 Format and structure

Teaching format	Online synchronous in small groups of up to 20 participants, complemented by accompanying formats and a documented practical phase
Synchronous contact time	8 course days (56 synchronous hours in total, four modules of two days)
Accompanying formats	2 × 3 hours of group case mentoring · 2 × 4 hours of intervention workshop · 1 × 1 hour of individual case mentoring · 5 × 2 hours of peer-consultation groups (documented) · documented practical phase with at least one of your own intervention or counselling cases · reflection journal
Required reading	HABA learning materials, course notes and intervention-specific in-depth texts (provided during the course)

7 Assessment of learning

9 Notes

The programme is structured in line with recognised quality standards; the corresponding recognitions are being prepared for each language region. The Level 2 certification is lifelong and documents the completed educational pathway. Using the HABA brand title in the present tense, using the HABA logo, the listing in the public HABA directory, as well as access to the HABA Toolbox and the HABA Community additionally require an active HABA licence. The HABA licence programme will be available with the first certifications from autumn 2026; details will be communicated in good time before the start.

Prices & accessibility: Effective bullying prevention and intervention should be possible everywhere — regardless of how different the economic conditions are across the world's regions. That is why the price depends on the country of residence: professionals in regions with lower purchasing power pay less, so that the programme stays fairly accessible both professionally and financially.
